Departures, Death, & Dignity


Have you ever seen the 2008 film Departures by Yojiro Takita? If you have not, STOP! Do not continue to read this article. Go find the movie (available at the library or you can rent it through Amazon), watch it, then continue reading. If you have seen it, then please continue.

What did you think of the film? Makes you view relationships and death in a different way, right? In a short amount of time we have had some deaths within our church family. These families are still in mourning as they try to continue on with their lives and handling the departed estates, pension, belongings, etc.

I saw this film right around the time I got ordained. Through the process, I had to learn how to do a funeral. I learned some things from classes, and got to assist in some funerals that helped me know more about the process of preparing a funeral. This film, however, opened my eyes to a whole new light about loss, death, and funerals. Because of this film, I have tired to put myself into the midst of the grieving family, learn about the one who has departed, and do my best to make sure my manner, my words, and my actions will help make the grieving process of the family and friends a healthy one. Some I have known for months, others I only known for days, but in both cases I do my best to make sure I know them, like I've known them all of my life.

Connected with people has always been a starting ground for building up loving relationships. It helps make people feel important, dignified, and loved. When it comes to the departed and their families that same rules apply. You may not know the family or the departed very well, but by being in the moment, giving up your time and resources, and pour godly love into them makes people know that they have someone to journey with them through this time. It also communicates to the departed that their loved ones are in good hands.

So when you know of someone who is going through loss, be in the moment with them, walk along beside them during this difficult journey, and be intentional when pouring into them the love of Christ.




The beautiful season of autumn......when God pulls out a new palette of colors and brightens the canvas around us! Like many things that occur in nature, we watch and enjoy but may not give much attention to the details of the creation.

Just how did God create the leaves to change into their magnificent colors? Photosynthesis, chloroplast, chlorophyll, carbon dioxide, glucose, deciduous trees......sounds like complicated words that most of us have not given much thought to since biology in school!

Let's put it in simpler terms. As the leaves of deciduous trees come out in spring in their fresh green color, the warmth and sunlight of the longer days are soaked up through the leaves. The sunlight enters a part of the leaf called the chloroplast; the chloroplast uses the sunlight to change carbon dioxide and water into breathable oxygen and further creates glucose for growth and nourishment of the tree. Chlorophyll within the chloroplast is the chemical that allows this process of photosynthesis to take place, and gives the leaves their green color. As the autumn season comes and the days of sunlight get shorter along with cooler temperatures, the leaves take in less sunlight which causes the chlorophyll to decrease, then the leaves lose their green color and change colors depending on pigmentation of the leaves. Eventually the leaves fall from the trees.

The amazing process of photosynthesis means "to put together with light." The leaves thrived and prospered while taking in a good supply of sunlight. We can compare our spiritual lives to photosynthesis. Our spiritual lives grow and prosper when we live in the light of Christ. Light reveals and clarifies; darkness hides, conceals and stunts growth. The light of Christ reveals our sin, the darkness in our lives, and transforms us as we allow His light to nourish us. The light of Christ will promote growth and strength. Unlike the leaves of the trees that dry and wither, God can continue "to put together with light" those who desire an abundance of "son-light". This light can carry us through the cold and harsher seasons of life as we allow God to nurture us with the light of Christ. (continued on next page)





Jon and Karen Lambert are our Church of God missionaries to Ecuador. In the past two months they have been experiencing the effects of a volcano, Cotopaxi, erupting causing earthquakes to their area. They have had days of cloudy skies with ash falling across the city. You can

imagine what kind of mess this makes on everything from trees, roofs, lawns, sidewalks, streets and cars. Street merchants are consistently fighting the ash and fumes from the volcano. The once snow capped volcano has now turned to black with orange lava flow. At this point there are no communities in the path of the lava flow. On the days when the wind flows away from Quito, Cotopaxi is a brilliant picture of God's amazing hand at work as the earth renews itself. This volcano has been dormant for the past 100 years and now is erupting daily. Quito has implemented sirens to go off in times when evacuation is eminent. Jon and Karen say they are safe but are keeping an eye on the situation. Jon says, "Never a dull day in Ecuador". Many of you will remember that Karen Lambert is the sister of one of our former pastors' wife, Mark and Linda Tincher. Please keep Jon and Karen Lambert in prayer as well as the over 2 million people who live in this area.
