# "Jesus on The Main Line" *April 2015*

Easter: A 50 day event


You probably are looking at the title and think I am crazy. Easter is one day, not 50 days. However, if we look at the history of Easter we see that it is 50 days. The 50 day period for the Israelites begins at Passover and goes until Shavuot. Passover is a celebration of when the Lord led them out of Egypt and Shavuot is the celebration when God gave Moses the 10 commandments; 50 days after the exodus from Egypt. Passover is a celebration of freedom and Shavuot is when God gave them the Law to help guide them to Righteousness. In-between those two celebratory days is known as the Feast of Weeks.

The Israelites from all over the world would journey to Jerusalem, by foot, for Passover. By the time Passover would be done and they would travel back home, they would have to turn back around to celebrate Shavuot. So most of the Israelites would stay in Jerusalem during that time and celebrate with food, music, and wine during that time between Passover and Shavuot, which is why they have the Feast of Weeks (side note: maybe we should have a potluck every single day after Easter until Pentecost. Good idea. Bad idea. I'll let you decide.)

Similarly, Easter represents freedom from the oppression of sin and Pentecost represents the pouring out of the Holy Spirit to help guide us to live out the Great Commandments and Commission. But, as a Protestant Christian, what should we do in between these Holy Days? When we look at the opening chapter in Acts, the disciples did three things: Wait, Pray, and find Judas' replacement. Since the Holy Spirit has already poured itself out, we don't need to wait for it. However, I would say that we may need a renewing of the Spirit in our lives and in the church.

So my challenge is that we devote ourselves to prayer during this time between Easter and Pentecost and ask for the Holy Spirit to revive use, to renew us, and to light a fire in our souls to make an impact for the Kingdom of Heaven.







Have you ever traveled the Emmaus Road? Maybe not the Emmaus Road a few miles from Jerusalem, but your own "Emmaus" Road. The road where plans didn't pan out how you thought and you are left feeling like you don't know where the road is taking you as you pick up the pieces of shattered dreams and brokenness.

That's how the two felt that day as they walked along the Emmaus Road beginning in Luke 24:13-35 with their sudden encounter with the risen Jesus. Jesus reminded them of what they knew about Jesus, he even reprimanded them in Luke 24:25. The two did not turn from him or run away. Rather, as Jesus seemed to be traveling on from their destination, they urged Jesus to stay with them.

Oh what an encounter that turned out to be! As they were at the table with Jesus, Jesus broke the bread and gave it to them. Luke 24:31: "Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight".

On our own "Emmaus" Road travels, a powerful prayer would be that our eyes be open to what God has for us. The divine directional signs on that road can be hope, perseverance, integrity......it may simply be that we recognize that God is right there in the midst and for that reason we choose to travel with him in peace!

"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms." Ephesians 1:18-20 (NIV)

The TLC will be having a chicken barbecue on May 23rd. The proceeds from this barbecue will go to help families in the church. The cost will be the same (\$4.00 per half).


